### 2018 Mountain / Back Country Ride Schedule

#### **MOUNTAIN RIDES (MT)**

- Mountain rides will require intermediate off-trail skill level, and be a mix of on and off trail riding.
- Portions of these rides will be in treed areas with somewhat technical and challenging terrain, and some modest side-hilling.
- There will plenty of chances for attempting steep climbs and descents.
- Avalanche rescue practice will be a part of these rides.
- There will be plenty of opportunities to ask questions and learn advanced mountain riding skills.

#### **MUST-HAVE ITEMS**

Modern long track MT sled, Beacon, Backpack with Shovel & Probe, GMRS radio.

#### **BACK COUNTRY RIDES (BC)**

- All Back Country rides will require the participant to possess advanced to expert level rider skills and be proficient in riding in technical back country terrain.
- These rides will be in steep, technical mountain & treed terrain and may pass above or below hazardous areas such as cornices and cliffs.

#### **MUST-HAVE ITEMS**

All of the items for the Mountain Rides plus Avalanche Air Bag and Basic Avalanche Rescue Training. These are advanced to expert level rides. You must be prepared for extreme conditions and long days.
