We sent out a survey to poll our membership on a variety of topics including ride



preferences and locations. This information will be useful as we design this season's schedule with the intent to encourage more participation at our rides. We've decided to increase our donations to charitable organizations to help those in need, while also getting our name out there in the public's eye. Our latest donation went to Tom's Turkey Drive and occurred on-air during one of KREM 2's afternoon broadcasts. We also just wrapped up our annual fundraising Snowmobile and Power Sports Expo/Swap Meet. At first glance, it looks like the show was a great success and everyone in attendance had a wonderful time. I may be missing something, but I think you get the idea.



Now that the groundwork has been laid and Winter is on its way, it's time to refocus on the fun part of it all. Time to purchase 3 states-worth of registrations and groomer tags, dust things off and make all the needed adjustments, break the bank on a gallon or so of oil, and grease the squeaking hinges on the trailer. There's nothing like cold air and blinding white to get me motivated. I probably should have been doing all of this earlier, but for some reason it slipped through the cracks. Search and Rescue

Hello from Search and Rescue and wishing all snowmobilers a safe and wonderful snowmobile season!! Please be prepared when you head out for the trails or backcountry! Remember to ride only in groups, carry emergency supplies, and be prepared for changing weather!!

So far, 2022 has been a quiet year with a few call outs, but none involving snowmobiles or ATV's. The big news this year is with the Winter Knights downsizing the rental storage shed, we are transitioning to the County Search and Rescue taking over ownership of our snowmobile, ATV, and trailer. This will still allow us to use the equipment for missions and training, but will be owned and stored by Spokane County. We expect this transfer of ownership to the County to occur this December. The Search and Rescue unit believes this will be the best long-term solution for our program.

We will be in contact with those that are interested in joining our program from the Snow Show. After being on pause, the Search and Rescue training meetings will resume after the first of the year.
