<u>Membership Renewal Invoices</u>

IT IS TIME TO RENEW YOUR MEMBERSHIP! Be on the lookout for your Winter Knights renewal invoice. It is being mailed on July 15. There are **2 NEW** pieces of information needed.

It is imperative that every member keep their contact information up-to-date. It is especially important that your email address is accurate, since this is our main form of contact with you throughout the year. Examples of important emails we send include: last-minute ride location or time changes, special events, meeting reminders, etc.

Membership Dues = \$30 per year

Mail your payment BY August 31, 2023 so your membership does not lapse, as September 1 is the start of the new 2023-24 season for both the Winter Knights and WSSA.

Please renew your membership through Winter Knights, <u>NOT</u> through WSSA directly. Once we update our club database, we will then update the WSSA database automatically for you. It is much easier on our end this way. However, for those of you that belong to other snowmobile clubs, feel free to check the box at the bottom of the form telling us that you don't want us to renew WSSA for you since you will be doing that on your own or through those primary clubs.

2 Ways to Renew your Membership!

1. Renew by updating contact information on the invoice and mailing it back with a check.

OR

2. Renew On-line and pay with PayPal. (convenience fee will be added) spokanewinterknights.com/membership-renewals and follow the instructions.

Newsletters: They are emailed to our membership for free. If you want yours mailed via the U.S. Post Office, there is an additional \$5 annual fee.

Liability Waiver: Included in your invoice envelope, you will find a copy of the Liability Waiver to be signed and dated by each member of your household. If you could please return it WITH your renewal payment, then I will have it on file and you won't need to worry about it the rest of the riding season! If renewing online, please scan the completed waiver and email a scanned copy of it to: spokanewinterknights@gmail.com. Unfortunately, the insurance company is requiring that <u>a new Liability Waiver be re-submitted yearly</u> by each member. It applies to club rides and events/functions.
