- 1. Graduating high school senior
- 2. 3.0 GPA
- 3. Attend an accredited college
- 4. Preference will be given to an active club member or relative of a Winter Knights member

No extensions will be given. ALL paperwork must be included in application. If application is submitted incomplete, it will not be included in the review process. Presentation will be an important part of the scholarship application evaluation.

Awarded participant/s will be notified via e-mail by March 29. Scholarship money will be mailed directly to recipient's college of choice.

Applicants **must** include:

- 1. An official high school transcript
- 2. Two letters of recommendation
- 3. Summary of awards/accomplishments (see guidelines below)
- 4. Essay (see guidelines below)
- 5. Application (below)

Summary of Awards/Accomplishments Guidelines:

On a separate piece of paper, please submit a brief summary of the following:

Special awards received in school

Special awards received in community or church

Activities participated in school

Activities participated in outside of school

Work experience

Volunteer experience

Essays will be judged on depth of content, clarity, organization and persuasiveness. Essay needs to be #12 font and at least two pages.

Essay Topic:

How do you, as a young snowmobiler, perceive how to get the business of the organization (your local club) done on a monthly/timely basis and not make the meeting boring, as is often a sentiment expressed.

Essay Challenge:

- 1. The business aspect of an organization includes finances, records/minutes, projects your club is doing for your local trail, fundraising and other club activities and decisions.
- The social aspect of an organization includes enticing meeting attendance, an enjoyable setting, membership growth and representation of your club at a higher level, such as at State Association, American Council of Snowmobile Associations (ACSA) or International Snowmobile Congress (ISC) meetings/events.
 - 3. How would you propose to transition an existing club into what you would like your club or club meetings to be like.
